If you are considering running for an open position, you must successfully complete PVA National's certification process and be certified by their secretary. Your name can still be placed on the ballot if the secretary has not certified you. However, you cannot assume an elected position until you have been certified.

The certification process is very simple, and several of the documents you may have already provided during the membership application process.

Certification requires:

- **Certification of Membership Eligibility Form** - Available at <https://wisconsinpva.org/forms>
- **Proof of Citizenship** (birth certificate, passport, immigration or naturalization paperwork)
- **Proof of Active Duty Service** in the Armed Forces and character of discharge other than dishonorable (DD-214)
- **Medical Documentation** of SCI/D, MS or ALS (physician's statement or medical records)

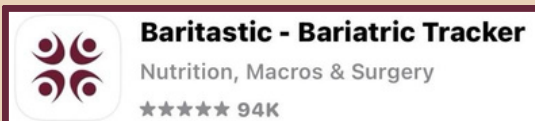

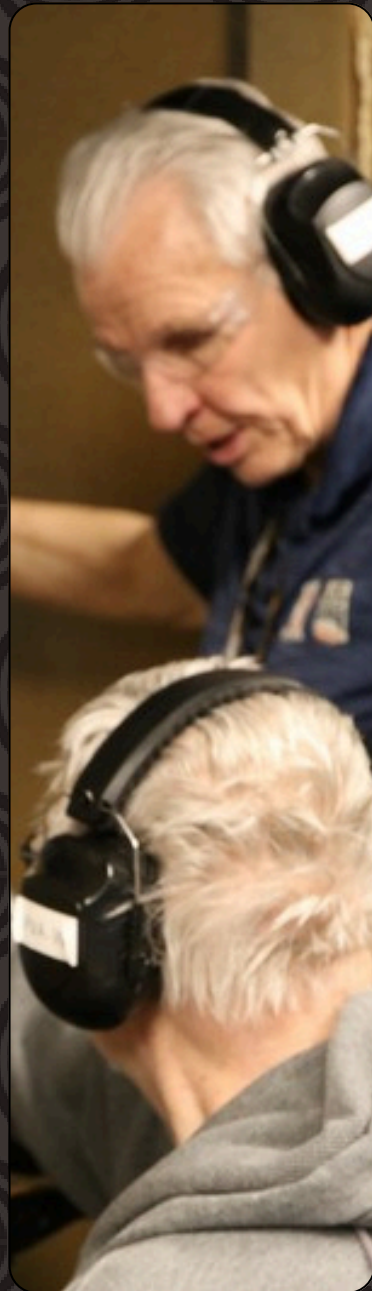

The convention highlighted PVA's ongoing commitment to protecting veterans' benefits, expanding accessibility, and ensuring veterans with disabilities have the resources and support needed to live independent and fulfilling lives.

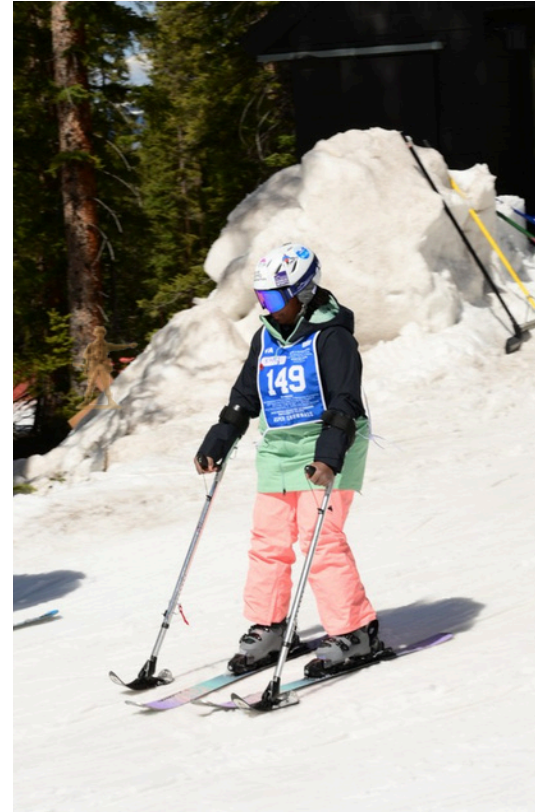
ADAPTIVE SPORTS PROGRAM SUPPORTS CAESAR'S WINTER SPORTS CLINIC TRIP

NSO REPORT

Purple Heart Day August 7th



Purple Heart Day is celebrated on August 7 and honors the brave men and women who were wounded, or gave their life, while serving our great country. This is not a federal holiday but provides the opportunity to reflect on everything that has gone before us. Showing a simple act of kindness, attending events, or donating to veteran organizations are all meaningful ways to thank veterans. While the requirements to receive the medal have changed over time and continue to evolve today, the Purple Heart is one of the most recognized and respected medals awarded to members of the U.S. Armed Forces.

History

The Purple Heart is prestigious among America's military decorations, honoring those courageous men and women who have made remarkable sacrifices while serving in the United States Armed Forces. As the nation's oldest award, its establishment dates back to 1782 when General George Washington created the Badge of Military Merit, which would later evolve into the Purple Heart as we know it today. The value of this celebrated decoration transcends time, continuing to hold immense importance within the veteran community.

Recognizing their selflessness and courage, the Purple Heart pays tribute to service members who have been wounded or lost their lives during their military duties. Over the years, the criteria for the award have been refined, reinforcing the commitment to honor those who have demonstrated courage in the face of adversity. This prestigious accolade strengthens our community's bonds, uniting us in our shared respect for our brave service members' exceptional determination and resilience. Beyond its significance as a prestigious military decoration, the Purple Heart comes with a range of benefits for the deserving recipients and their families.

Key VA and Federal Benefits

- **Prioritized Health Care:** Purple Heart recipients receive enhanced VA benefits, including automatic placement in Priority Group 3, which exempts them from VA copayments for inpatient and outpatient care.
- **VA Claim Processing:** Claims are prioritized and expedited, with Priority Group 1 consideration.

NSO REPORT CONT.

MS. BRENDA STENCIL, NATIONAL SERVICE OFFICER (NSO)

- Education: Purple Heart recipients who served on active duty after September 10, 2001, are eligible for 100% of the Post-9/11 GI Bill benefits, regardless of time in service.
- Yellow Ribbon Program: Purple Heart recipients can transfer benefits to dependents, and they are eligible for the Yellow Ribbon Program. This program can help pay for higher out-of-state, private school, foreign school, or graduate school tuition and fees that the Post-9/11 GI Bill does not cover.
- Federal Hiring Preference: Purple Heart recipients with an honorable discharge receive preferential hiring in government jobs.
- Home Loan Funding Fee Exemption: Veterans receiving disability compensation and active-duty members with a Purple Heart are exempt from the VA funding fee, regardless of disability rating.
- Commissary and Military Welfare and Recreation MWR Access: Purple Heart recipients and their caregivers have full access to military commissaries, exchanges, and Morale, Welfare, and Recreation (MWR) facilities.
- Burial: Purple Heart recipients are eligible for burial at Arlington National Cemetery and other VA national cemeteries.

Key Wisconsin Purple Heart Benefits

- Wisconsin GI Bill: While typically for service-connected disability, Purple Heart recipients may find expedited access to education benefits (tuition remission for 8 semesters) at UW or technical colleges.
- Hunting and Fishing Licenses: Residents with a Purple Heart can purchase a Conservation Patron license for \$10.
- Bear/Turkey/Elk Hunting: One-time transfer of a Class A Bear license and eligibility to purchase a spring turkey harvest authorization without a drawing. Eligible to submit an elk hunting application, whether a resident or nonresident.
- Specialized Purple Heart license plate.
- Purple Heart Pass: A Milwaukee County-initiated program (for Wisconsin recipients/residents) granting free access to various venues and attractions across Wisconsin. Some of the participating venues include but are not limited to the Milwaukee County Zoo, Milwaukee Art Museum, EAA Museum in Oshkosh, and the Highground Veterans Memorial Park in Neillsville.
